Muhl Park & Soccer Complex 290 Trease Rd.
This area totals 28 acres of open field on the southwest side of town. There are multiple soccer fields, a rentable pavilion, a playground, basketball courts and restrooms.

Durling Park 254 East Boyer Street
Durling is located between Prospect Street and E. Boyer Street, and has 4 tennis courts, a basketball court, a ball field, a playground, restrooms, and a rentable pavilion.

Wintergreen Park 630 Hillcrest Drive
Wintergreen is located on the edge of the Wintergreen development behind Wadsworth High School. There is a rentable pavilion, basketball court, playground, and trails.

Trolley Line Park & House 631 Silvercrest Rd.
Trolley Line Park is nestled in a picturesque rural setting. Its entrance is near the intersection of Silvercrest and Durling. The Trolley Line House has a unique pollinator garden that begins blooming in early May and attracts birds and insects. Both the house and pavilion are available for reservations.

Parsons Admin. Ball Field 524 Broad Street
Wadsworth City Parks manages the ball field behind the former Overlook Elementary School, which now houses the school system's administrative offices.

Weatherstone Park 1404 Reimer Road
This Park is located on the northeast end of Wadsworth near Weatherstone development. This 5.5 acre park has ball fields, a pavilion, and restrooms.

Terraceview Park 250 Terraceview Avenue
Located by Hard Street and W. Bergey, this park has a pavilion, playground, fenced play area, and a sandbox.

Northwoods Park 207 Hollybrier Drive
Located in the northeast section, Northwoods has a pavilion, basketball court, playground, and paved path.

Northside Christian Church Ball Field 7615 Ridge Road
Wadsworth City Parks manages the ball field at Northside Christian Church, off of Ridge Road.

Valley View Park & Dog Park 618 West St.
Located on the north section of town, this 15 acre park has two basketball courts, a ball field, a rentable pavilion, playground, restrooms, and the city's only skateboard park.

Franklin Park 137 Pine Street
Located at Pine Street and S. Lyman Street, the park has a pavilion, basketball court and playground.

Old Bird Park 505 Bird Street
Old Bird Park adjoins New Bird Park and has a rentable pavilion, playground, and fields for soccer and lacrosse.

New Bird Park 560 Bird Street
New Bird Park, located off E. Bergey Street, sits on over 26 acres. With a rentable pavilion, it includes a baseball field plus the youth football fields at Fieldcrest.

Miller Park 266 Chestnut Street
Miller Park is a 5 acre park with two ball fields and a playground between Chestnut Street and Fairview Ave.

First Street "Tot Lot" 196 First Street
The "Tot Lot" is located off of First Street and Auble Street. This lot has a play area and sandbox.

Kaleidoscope Playground 155 Ault Street
This eastern section of Memorial Park includes a 14,000 square foot wooden play structure built by volunteers and is adjacent to tennis courts and a ball field.

A.C. Field 441 College Street
This ball field is located right off of College Street, on the northern section of Memorial Park.

Memorial Park 279 Grandview Avenue
Memorial Park is the oldest and second largest park in Wadsworth. Named in memory of the fallen heroes of the Second World War, Memorial Park has several reservable shelters, a large lake with a paved path, and other amenities.

Friedt Park 415 Leatherman Road
Friedt Park adjoins Holmesbrook Park on the north side and can be accessed off Leatherman Road. Friedt Park has several sports fields and one of the best sledding hills in the Wadsworth area.

Holmesbrook Park 600 College Street
Holmesbrook Park is the largest of all Wadsworth City parks. Located off College Street near Summa Wadsworth-Rittman Hospital, Holmesbrook is a densely forested park with several trails and sights.

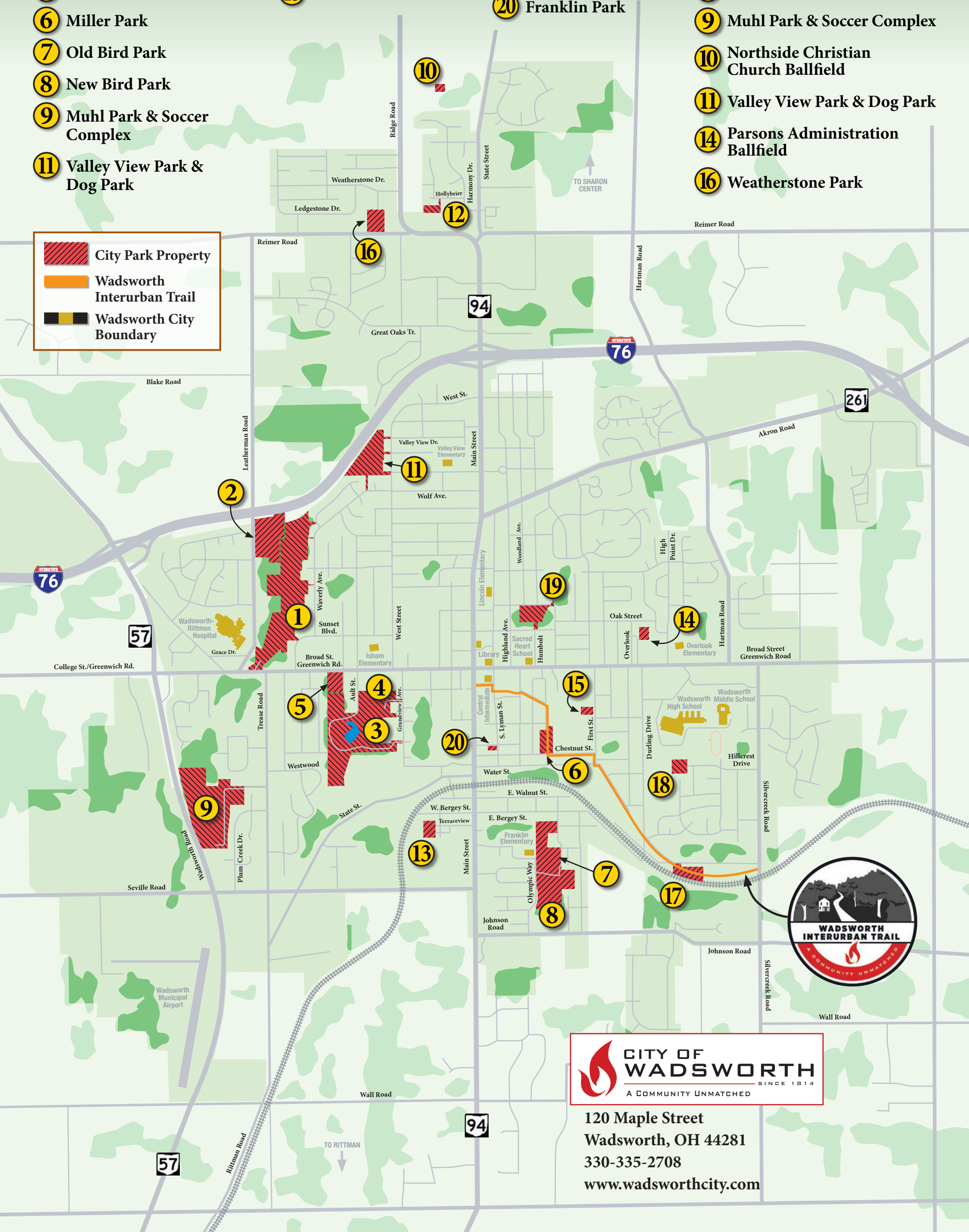
